


# THE DEFINITIVE MAP AND STATEMENT OF PUBLIC RIGHTS OF WAY FOR THE COUNTY OF LANCASHIRE

This Order is made by Lancashire County Council ("the authority") under Section 53(2)(b) of the Wildlife and Countryside Act, 1981 ("the Act") because it appears to that authority that The Definitive Map and Statement of Public Rights of Way for the County of Lancashire require modification in consequence of the occurrence of an event specified in Section 53(3)(c)(i) of the Act namely the discovery by the surveying authority of evidence which (when considered with all other relevant evidence available to them) shows that a right of way which is not shown in the map and statement subsists or is reasonably alleged to subsist over land in the area to which the map relates, namely a restricted byway.

1. For the purposes of this Order, the “relevant date” is 11 December 2024.
2. The Definitive Map and Statement of Public Rights of Way for the County of Lancashire shall be modified as described in Part I and Part II of the Schedule and shown on the map attached to the Order.
3. This Order shall take effect on the date it is confirmed and may be cited as The Lancashire County Council Restricted Byway from Aikengill Road to Ringstones Lane, Tatham, Definitive Map Modification Order 2024.

## SCHEDULE

### PART I

#### MODIFICATION OF THE DEFINITIVE MAP

##### DESCRIPTION OF PATH OR WAY TO BE ADDED

Restricted byway from an open junction with Aikengill Road (point A on the Order Map) in a generally east south easterly direction crossing an area of rough moorland grasses for a distance of approximately 20 metres before joining a compact but grassy track which then runs the full length of the route to the south of a lower lying feature known as Aikengill Dub through to the open junction with Ringstones Lane where it joins Slaidburn Road (point B).

The route is shown on the Order Map between points A-B as a broken green line.

The total length of the route is 0.30 km and the unenclosed width varies between 3 and 5 metres.

#### MODIFICATION OF DEFINITIVE STATEMENT

##### VARIATION OF PARTICULARS OF PATH OR WAY

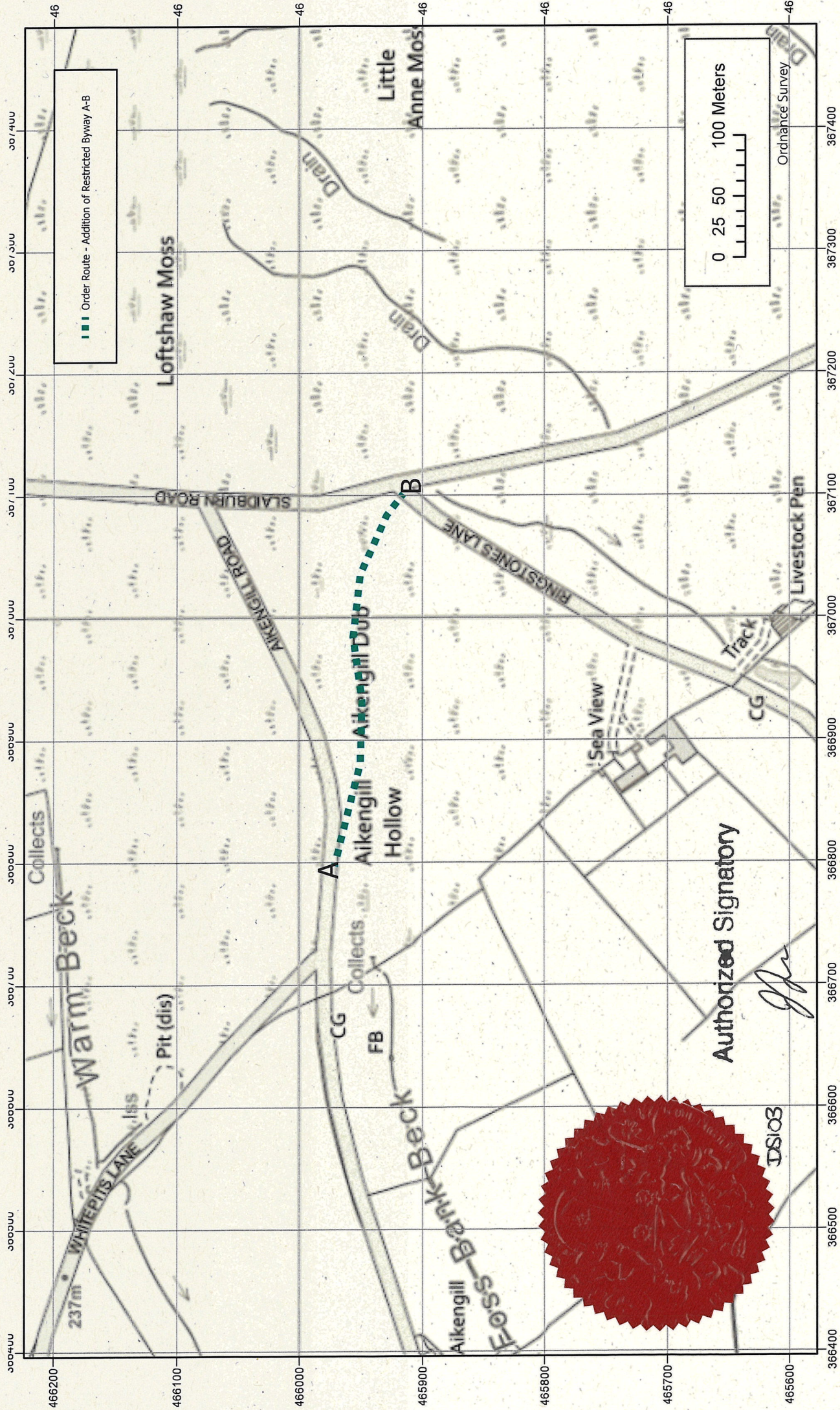
Position: " Restricted byway from an open junction with Aikengill Road at Grid Reference SD 6678 6597 in a generally east south easterly direction crossing an area of rough moorland grasses before joining a compact but grassy track which then runs the full length of the route to the south of a lower lying feature known as Aikengill Dub through to the open junction with Ringstones Lane where it joins Slaidburn Road at SD 6710 6592."

Length: "0.30km"

Other particulars: "Width varies between 3 and 5 metres as shown on the Ordnance Survey 25 inch Sheet XXX.3 surveyed 1890 and published 1891.
